Woree State High School will receive

\$ 589,000

This funding will be used to

- Guarantee that Identified students have an evidenced-based learning plan in place to address their specific learning needs
- Increase the % of Year 7 students meeting the National Minimum Standard (NMS) in Reading from 89.1.6% to 95% by 2018.
- Increase the % of Year 7 students meeting NMS in Numeracy from 89.6% to 95% by 2018.
- Increase the % of Year 9 students meeting NMS in Reading from 84% to 90% by 2018.
- Increase the % of Year 9 students meeting NMS in Numeracy from 96.5% to 98% by 2018.
- Increase the percentage of students achieving a 'C' standard or above in English, Mathematics and Science from 60% in 2017 to 70% in 2018

Attendance (Headline Indicators)

- Improve attendance rate from 83% in 2017 to 90% in 2018
- Improve attendance rate <85 from 36.2% in 2017 to 28% in 2018

Year 12 Attainment

- Improvement in QCE attainment from 99% in 2017 to 100% 2018

Our initiatives include

Focus on the development and implementation of the Response to Intervention System

1. High Quality Teaching

- Implement the Teaching and Learning System and continue to build teacher capability in explicit teaching through the Teacher Capability Development System (Evidence: Archer and Hughes- Explicit Instruction and Hollingsworth and Ybarra) and intensive coaching of staff.

2. Effective Intervention (Remedial/Extension)

- Implement the Literacy and Numeracy strategy (7-9) including the Junior Secondary Reading and Writing Program
- Implement intensive Literacy and Numeracy Programs for students below NMS
- Utilise the One School Individual Curriculum Plan (ICP) for all students below Reading, Writing and Numeracy NMS
- Continuous, short-term data and feedback cycles (5 week) of students on ISP focused on a narrow and sharp area of improvement are recommended.
- Implement the NAPLAN strategy for the school
- Continue to develop the Schoolwide Positive Behaviour Support- Learning to Learn

3. Case Management

- Development of Intensive Literacy and Numeracy courses to deliver precise support for students
- Academic Supervision Program extended to Junior Secondary through the Junior Certificate Education process. Intense management of QCE and OP eligible students to ensure completion
